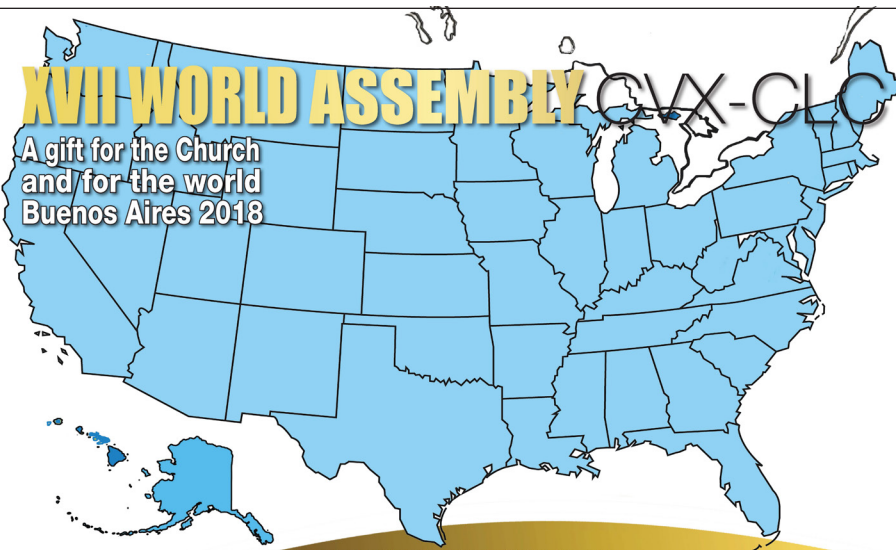

## BRIEF CLC HISTORY IN THE UNITED STATES

- 1967: Members of USA Sodality attended the Third World Congress of Laity and World Federations of Sodality Assembly, became CLC
- 1967-1995: Communities became more diverse both culturally and in terms of language
- 1995: First Spanish-speaking CLC affiliated to CLC-USA
- 1996: Korean CLC (KCLC) affiliated to CLC-USA
- 2004: Vietnamese CLC (Dong Hanh) affiliated to CLC-USA
- 2005: Spanish-speaking CLCs in South Florida became South Florida Region
- 2017: Polish-speaking CLC affiliated to CLC-USA
